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WELCOME

WORSHIP

Take some time to pray and ask God to clear your mind, calm your heart, fix your focus, and give insight as you get ready to study a passage.

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WORD

Read Matthew 4:1-11.

Step 1: Observe

The goal is to figure out what is happening in Matthew 4:1-11.

- 1. Who are the characters in the passage?
- 2. When and where does the event in the passage take place?
- 3. What decisions are made in this passage?
- 4. What words or phrases are unique, repeated, or emphasized?
- 5. What emotions are being displayed by the characters in the passage?

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Step 2: Interpret

The goal is to determine the purpose and meaning of Matthew 4:1-11.

- 1. What are some reasons the author might have included this passage in the book?
- 2. Are there Old Testament verses or references in this passage? If so, which Old Testament verses or references are used and why are they used?
- 3. How does this passage (it's themes, characters, places, etc.) align with the gospels, the New Testament, and the Bible as a whole?
- 4. What does the passage teach about God's character and grace?
- 5. What themes are present in this passage (examples of themes include love, salvation, forgiveness, humility, unity, etc.)?

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Step 3: Apply

The goal is to reflect on how Matthew 4:1-11 impacts your life today.

- 1. Is there sin in the passage to be avoided?
- 2. Are there any promises in the passage to claim?
- 3. Are there any attitudes in the passage to adjust?
- 4. Is there a challenge in the passage to accept?
- 5. Is there an example in the passage to follow?

Give an update on the person that you want to invite to church and share Jesus with.

- Memorize Deuteronomy 8:3.
- Use the "Observe, Interpret, Apply" method to study 3 Bible stories (choose any Bible stories/passage/verses).
